

THE BEARD CUP VICTORY!


The Beard Cup is a magnificent trophy which was first competed for in 1929 when it was won by Oldham CTC. A convincing win in the Beard Cup Hill climb at Diggle saw the Club take the trophy for the first time in 31 years. This year the Club set about ending the barren run by fielding 30 riders, 4 of which are members of the Blue Belles Group, out of the field of 60 and being represented in all categories including Youth, Junior, Ladies, Tourist, Senior and Team.

The weather was glorious and the riders had no complaints to make as they tackled the 1 mile climb with a gradient of 10%, starting from Diggle village and finishing just short of the junction with the main Standedge Road.

The whole Event was started by Club President John Howard and quickly followed at one minute's intervals by the East Lancs contingent.

The Club secured wins by Pauline Cooper (8m 27.4s) in the Ladies category, Ben Trippier (5m 46.8s) in the Junior category and Sam Walley 2nd (5m 37.6s) in the Youth category which was won by Henry Cash from Holme Valley CC. Lauren Bateson won the Junior Ladies category in 10m 25.4s. Simon Abraham took the Tourist prize in 6m 50.9s.







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8000FT RELIABILITY RIDE

Sixteen intrepid Club riders set out on a bright and sunny Sunday morning to ride the 8000ft Reliability Ride. The challenging 60 mile route took in Huddersfield Road out of Newhey, Mottram Cutting, Glossop, Holme Moss to Holmfirth for a lunch stop. The afternoon part of the route went over Meltham, Barkisland, Slaithwaite, Ripponden and Blackstone Edge to finish at Hollingworth Lake Leisure Centre. All the riders finished within the time limit.

Chris Green was 2^{nd} (5m 04.9s) and Danny Brejwo 3^{rd} (5m 15.2s) overall. The fastest individual rider was Wilf Sargeant from the West Pennine RC with an excellent time of exactly 5 minutes.

The main award is however the Beard Cup, which goes to the fastest team of three riders and this year it was won by Chris Green, Danny Brejwo and Ian Grime for the Club, claiming the cup back from Saddleworth Clarion CC who were deserved winners last year.

Everyone was a winner in the Club last Sunday, with many riders tackling a hill climb for the first time.


Everyone got personal best times, someone achieved more than they thought possible by staying on the bike and not having to push, and most importantly all had a fantastic day just taking part.

The enthusiasm amongst us ladies for supporting each other in whatever we want to do on and with our bikes is great, and the key to the achievements we are making.


Look forward to us all catching up at the curry night on Friday.

TWO STAGE HILL CLIMB SUCCESS

The Club's RRG Skoda sponsored two stage hill climb took place on Sunday 14th September. In marked contrast to last year dry, sunny and relatively warm weather meant a promising start to proceedings.

Leaving from race HQ at the Conservative Club in Littleborough the riders took on the short, sharp sprint in Blackstone Edge Old Road first. Although only 0.4 miles in length the changes in gradient and the overall steepness of the road make for a real challenge as riders try to maintain a sprint pace up the hill. Stage one was won by 2013 winner Lee Baldwin from Champion Systems in the time of 1m 44.2s to take the Stage one victory by 1.6s from Henry King.

Stage two followed the more traditional 2 mile route up Blackstone Edge on the main road. It was won convincingly by Henry king in the time of 8m 25.2s to place him 23 seconds ahead of Lee Baldwin, giving him the overall aggregate win by 21s.

Third place on both stages gave Chris Dyke from Manchester Wheelers the same placing overall, while Theo Jefferies from Westmead Team 88 was best Junior and Henry Cash from Holme Valley Wheelers was best Juvenile.

Paul Targett from Pendle Forest CC finished as best Veteran, while Claire Munton from the Vegetarian C&AC was top lady.

Henry King takes home the RRG Skoda trophy for twelve months. The trophy is sure to be well contested next year. Plenty of riders vowed to be back with their fellow Club members after commenting on what a well run and friendly event it was. A credit to us all!

RACE REPORTS

Clayton Velo Road Race (31st August)

The East Lancs were in action at the Clayton Velo Road Race last Sunday.

This 44 mile road race was for 3rd and 4th Category riders based on the long circuit at Bashall Eaves near Clitheroe and it was a clear bright day which saw a maximum field of 60 riders start in the Peloton, which included Chris Green and Ben Trippier for the Club.

The early pace was brisk including the first climb on the circuit, which saw some of the less fit riders struggle and lose contact with the peloton on the first climb. However the pace settled down and at the end of the first lap two riders went clear off the front to try their luck, but were quickly brought back into the bunch.

The East Lancs riders featured well in the early stages particularly Chris who was competing in his first road race. Chris lead the bunch on most the climbs and was comfortably placed near the front throughout most of the race, but on the day it wasn't Ben Trippier's race and at the end of the 3rd lap he lost contact with the few riders which remained in the peloton.


On the final lap, one rider went clear on the climb and the bunch didn't react, which was sufficient enough for the rider from Huddersfield Star Wheelers to establish a 30 second lead which he maintained for the last 10 miles to achieve a great solo victory.

In the following bunch they were preparing for a sprint finish and Chris lost his chain with 1Km to the line. However he was able to re-engage it and almost













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DAVE RAYNER FUND DINNER

To be held on the November, this is a premier event, aimed specifically at raising funds to support young riders from Great Britain, who are aiming to become top class cyclists. The fund provides talented riders with either 6 or 9 month bursaries to allow them to race in mainland Europe. Through its network extensive continental based ex-pats, it also provides practical, on the ground support. The ex-pats help place riders in the development and feeder teams the of maior professional trade teams, who ride events such as The Tour de France. Many of our top international riders received support from the fund, and attend the dinner to show their support for the fund, which gave them the opportunity to pursue their dreams.

The dinner always take place in the North of England. This year is the 20th anniversary of the fund and the dinner will take place at the Royal Armouries in Leeds.



Both lads did very well in their sectors with Noah coming in 16th in his competition and Sam Walley coming in 2nd out of 12 other competitions in his competition.




Noah & Sam at the Blackpool Triathlon
