




### THURSDAY NIGHT TRAINING SESSIONS

### **SUMMER TOUR 2017**

Initially, we considered Lake Garda for our Summer Tour but suitable accommodation was proving to be a problem and so we have looked at the cycling mecca of Majorca and the northern resort of Porta Pollensa.

Cycling in Majorca is fantastic with rides to suit all demands, flat, hilly, short, long, the road surfaces are generally good and the motorists considerate, plus the sun shines all day.

The hotel we have selected is the Fergus Style Pollensa Park & Spa, Puerto Pollensa. This is a four-star hotel which is 100 metres from a great beach and a 5-10 minute stroll down the promenade to the centre.

- 3. Costs £1224 per person 'all inclusive'.
- 4. The price includes flight and transfers.
- 5. I have asked that families can be next door to each other and we can be all on the same level.
- 6. The only extras are the bikes. We do not know the exact price but it will be no more that £90.00 per bike box. There is a storage area for bikes as it is a cycling hotel.
- 7. The flight times are leaving Manchester 6.40am.
- 8. Return flights are 11.55am from Majorca.
- 9. An initial deposit of £60.00 per person is required.

### **NEW CLUB AUDAX COMPETITION**

Audax riding has is increasingly popular with many Club members. We have decided to recognise this with an award.

There is an established series of events held throughout the year, which are organised by Audax UK. These events are a like Sportives and our own Reliability Rides. They are not races they are generally distance rides with a time limit in pleasant areas for cycling all over the country. A rider can take part in these events without necessarily being a member of Audax UK.

Each event will have a specific route and distance and the successful completion of each Audax ride will earn the rider kilometre points equivalent to the distance cycled in each event. In addition, at each event every rider is issued with a Brevet Card, which has to be signed by course marshals. It is a requirement for each rider to get their Brevet Card signed at each one of the prescribed marshal points, and especially at the finish, to qualify for the kilometre points just ridden.

We will hold separate Men's and Women's competitions with no further categories.

To ensure no one has an unfair advantage by having already undertaken some Audax rides, the start of the 2017 competition will be the 1<sup>st</sup> February 2017, although this may change in future years.

The rules we have established for the 2017 competitions are as follows.

- 1. Qualifying Events must be held under the auspices of Audax UK. No other rides, events or sportives will be applicable;
- 2. The winner of the Men's and Women's competitions will be the male and female with the most kilometres ridden during the qualifying season;
- 3. To gain qualifying kilometres, each rider must submit a copy of signed Brevet Cards for EACH RIDE undertaken to the Club BAR Secretary, currently Gareth Snell, who will validate the ride and kilometres earned
- 4. We will endeavour to maintain a points table and publish it on the web site and Newsletter, like the BAR competition, so that our members can see how they are doing in the competitions
- 5. Audax rides will NOT qualify for Points in the CTC BAR Competition. These are now two separate competitions and each member must choose which competition they wish to participate in
- 6. In 2017 only Audax events between 1<sup>st</sup> February and 30<sup>th</sup> November will apply to the competition and the winners will be announced/confirmed at the Riders Dinner.
- 7. All males go in the men's competition and all females go in the Women's competition irrespective of age.

Any other issues or matters not mentioned above (of which there are bound to be some) which arise or occur during the 2017 competitions will be decided by the Club Committee, whose decision shall be final.
