

On a fine day in August Mark Riley and I packed our bikes into boxes kindly donated by Simon and made our way to Liverpool Airport. A short 2 hour Ryan Air flight found us in the Arrivals hall at Nimes airport trying to re-assemble our bikes at 3pm in 30° temperatures. Mark's chain had looped over itself several times and my rear mech had become detached.

An hour later and with greasy hand saw us on the way to our first overnight stop at Avignon. We arrived breathless and tired (for some reason Mark decided he wanted a two-up time trial for the last 30k into town!) A pleasant night spent eating our Carrefour bought dinner sat on the steps of the local church sent us to bed well tired out.


Then next day we rode to Vaison La Romaine and then onto to Buis les Barronniers. We had some difficulty finding our way out of Avignon but were soon riding on hot, open roads with temperatures well into the 30's and spectacular views of Mont Ventoux to the east. August in France is the main holiday season and we were lucky to get the last pitch on several of the campsite (yes and we did both sleep in the same tent for the whole fortnight!)

Next day was a delightful ride down the Gorge d'Ubriex, an easy climb up the Col de la Pierge, and lunch was taken while we descended the beautiful Jabron Valley for over 30k into Sisteron.

A couple of day's easy riding in very hot weather found us at 3 o'clock in the afternoon just outside Barcelonnette. Our plans were to camp there and then tackle the Col de Cayole (2,632m) the following day. However, the heat must have got to Mark as he insisted we didn't stop but ride the climb that afternoon!! 30k and two and a half and hours later we reached the top. As Alpine climbs go very long but an easy gradient average 5% topping out near the top at 8%


