PHIL RHODES AT THE WILMSLOW TRIATHLON



I recently took part in the South Manchester (Wilmslow) Triathlon organised by XtraMile Events. This was my fourth Tri of the year, and my first ever year of taking part in the sport. This event was by far the largest in which I have competed, with in excess if 600 entrants and 515 actual participants on the day.

This was a 'Sprint' Distance, beginning with a 400m (16 lengths) pool based swim, a 24.2km cycle ride and finishing with a 6.1km run.

The weather was great, sun shining and little wind...perfect conditions. I completed my swim in a time of around 8:30 and exited the pool, into transition and onto my bike for the cycle leg. The route was fairly flat and this meant the times should be good, I pushed quite hard and managed to complete the loop in around 45 mins... an average speed of 20mph...I was really pleased so far. Then into transition again to change my shoes and off into the leafy streets of Wilmslow to complete the (painful!!) run section. On the whole this route was also flat...but with 2 short steep climbs and 2 footbridges to negotiate, it was pretty tough, especially towards the end! Just over 30 minutes of running later I finished!





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BC YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

British Cycling's Youth Development Sessions are starting on the 15th October. Riders aged between 14 and 23 eligible to take are part. I would thoroughly recommend anyone thinking of giving it a go, to get yourself booked on an event straight away!
