RIDING BRITAIN'S TOUGHEST ROAD?

Darryl Nolan takes us on a ride over one of Britain's toughest roads.

I have just spent a few weeks travelling round the south of England. One of the stops was in Bridport Dorset which coincided with a recent article in Cycling Weekly about the toughest roads in Britain. One was Bridport to Abbotsbury given a rating of 8 out of 10. The road has a length of 8.75 miles and climbs 258 meters. You know what? I just had to give it a go. Before reaching. Abbotsbury, I took the NCN 2 route from Bridport through the Bride Valley. A beautiful traffic free road but with a steep climb out of the valley. A fast downhill to Abbotsbury and the route proper began with a gradient of 20% out of Abbotsbury.









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HILL CLIMBS TO ENTER

A fast downhill to Abbotsbury and the route proper began. 20% out of Abbotsbury. At the top great sea views and then it's a rolling descent into West Bay (the setting for the TV series Broadchurch) and on to Bridport. For rolling descent read ramps of 20% with some swoops down. In all 20 miles of riding 2,000 feet of climbing.
