From Oldham comes in down Broad Lane, Oldham Road, Wood Street, Molesworth Street, John Street, St Mary's Gate, Newgate, Esplanade, Mellor Street, Spotland Bridge, Edenfield Road, Owd Betts.

This will be an exciting opportunity to see some of the top pro riders up close and also attract lots of people to come out and watch. The Council are also looking to organise some events in Rochdale Town Centre and Norden.to coincide with the race and to also promote cycling, health and well being and to include children and young people as much as possible.

- 3rd Jake Womersley (Crimson Orientation Marketing) Cat2

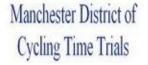

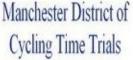
